History

Trinity Hill, so named for the three families who founded the winery in 1987, has become one of New Zealand's top producers of premium and super-premium wine since its first vintage in 1996. The combination of meticulous estate vineyards, a cutting-edge winery, and a stellar viticulture/winemaking team results in the production of consistent, top-flight, highly regarded wines.

Vineyards

Hawkes Bay has a temperate, maritime climate distinctly influenced by the Pacific Ocean to the east and protected from the west by a mountain range, giving low rainfall with the predominantly western weather pattern. A number of different microclimates and soils make it a unique and versatile winemaking region.

The majority of Trinity Hill's grapes come from the unique gravel soils and microclimate of the Gimblett Gravels region. These vineyards are characterized by free-draining soils and low fertility, giving small crops with highly concentrated flavors and aromas. Two estate vineyards, Gimblett Road and Gimblett Stones, comprise nearly 50 acres each.
